**Applicants to the Online Bachelor of Science in Business Administration program are required to have:**

- Demonstrated experience in post-secondary studies through the completion of 60 semester units (90 or more quarters) of college credits from an accredited institution after high school graduation
- Completed at least 30 semester (45 quarter) units of general education courses
- Completed transferable courses with grades of C- or better in oral communication, written composition, and critical thinking
- Completed one transferable course with a grade of C- or better in college-level mathematics or quantitative reasoning
- A cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better in all transferable college courses attempted for CA residents and 2.4 or better for non-CA residents
